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SECTION I
INTRODUCTION

SUMMARY OF REPORT

The regular annual actuarial valuation of the City of Holly Hill Police Officers' Retirement Trust Fund, performed as of October 1, 2002, has been completed and the results are presented in this Report. The contribution amounts set forth herein are applicable to the City's fiscal year ended September 30, 2003.

The contribution requirements, compared with those set forth in the October 1, 2001 actuarial valuation, are as follows:

* State Contribution shown is the amount received by the City during the fiscal year ended September 30, 2002. The City may use up to \$108,155.81 in State Contributions in order to determine its minimum funding requirements to the Plan.

As can be seen, the Total Required Contribution has increased both in dollar amount and when expressed as a percentage of Total Annual Payroll. These increases are attributable to net unfavorable actuarial experience during the past year. The principal components of actuarial losses included a 0.2% investment return (Actu-

arial Asset basis) that was significantly less than the 8.0% assumption and average salary increases which exceeded the assumed rate. These losses were partially offset by the effects of favorable turnover.

The balance of this Report presents additional details of the actuarial valuation and the general operation of the Fund. The undersigned would be pleased to meet with the Board of Trustees in order to discuss the Report and any pending questions concerning its contents.



ACTUARIAL ASSUMPTIONS AND FUNDING METHODS

<u>Assumptions</u>	
<u>Mortality Rate</u>	1983 GAM Table - Sex Distinct.
<u>Interest Rate</u>	8% per year compounded annually, net of investment related expenses.
<u>Retirement Age</u>	Earlier of age 55 and 10 years of service, or the completion of 20 years of service, regardless of age. Also, any member who has reached Normal Retirement is assumed to continue employment for one additional year.
<u>Early Retirement</u>	Commencing with eligibility for Early Retirement Age (age 50 with 10 years of Service), members are assumed to retire with an immediate subsidized benefit at the rate of 5% per year.
<u>Disability Rate</u>	See table below (1201).
<u>Termination Rate</u>	See table below (1302).
<u>Salary Increases</u>	6.0% per year until the assumed retirement age; see table below. Projected salary at retirement is increased 20% to account for non-regular compensation.

Funding Method

Aggregate Actuarial Cost Method.

VALUATION NOTES

Total Annual Payroll is the projected annual rate of pay for the fiscal year following the valuation date of all covered Members.

Present Value of Benefits is the single sum value on the valuation date of all future benefits to be paid to current Members, Retirees, Beneficiaries, Disability Retirees and Vested Terminations.

Normal (Current Year's) Cost is the current year's cost for benefits yet to be funded.

Total Required Contribution is equal to the Normal Cost adjusted for interest according to the timing of contributions during the year.

Aggregate Actuarial Cost Method is the method used to determine required contributions under the Plan. The use of this method involves the systematic funding of the Normal Cost (described above).

Actuarial Assets is the asset value used to determine the funding requirements. The value is determined by computing the average market value rate of return (net of investment related expenses) for each of the four years preceding the valuation date. Actuarial Assets on the valuation date are then determined by assuming that the Fund experienced this average rate of return during the 12 month period ending on

the valuation date. Per Chapter 112, Florida Statutes, and Section 1.412(c)(2)-1 of the Treasury Regulations, Actuarial Assets are limited to the greater of 120% of the Market Value of the Fund on the valuation date or 115% of the Average Value (described below) of plan assets as of that date.

Average Value (Reg 1.412(c)(2)-1(7)) is the average market value of the Fund on the valuation date and each of the three preceding valuation dates increased from the preceding valuation dates to the current valuation date by the net increase (decrease) in assets attributable to additions (contributions, interest and dividends, but excluding appreciation in the fair market value) and subtractions (benefit payments and expenses, but excluding depreciation in the fair market value).

ACTUARIAL ASSET VALUATION
September 30, 2002

Actuarial Assets for funding purposes are developed by increasing the Actuarial Assets used in the most recent actuarial valuation of the Fund by the average annual market value rate of return (net of investment related expenses) for the past four years, but are limited by the greater of 120% of Market Value or 115% of the four year Average Value (see Valuation Notes).
