

## FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has received the subgrant application for City of Holly Hill's Sunrise Park South pier demolition and seawall restoration due to damages in Hurricane Irma (DR-4337-FL PW-03498). Pursuant to Executive Order 11988 and 44 CFR Part 9.12, final notice is hereby given of FEMA's intent to provide funding for this project under the Public Assistance (PA) Program.

An initial disaster-wide Public Notice was published October 6, 2017 for Hurricane Irma. Comments and other information received were fully evaluated by FEMA along with evaluation of social, economic, environmental, and safety considerations. This notice serves as a project-specific final notice for FEMA's funding action located within the floodplain.

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions. This action complies with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements.

<b>Floodplain:</b>	Project is located in the AE Zone per Volusia County FIRM Panel #12127C0356J dated 09/29/2017.
<b>Proposed Work and Purpose:</b>	The City of Holly Hill has chosen to demolish the Sunrise Park South fishing pier in lieu of replacing it. Additionally, the City will demolish 325 linear feet (LF) of the concrete sheet-pile seawall, including railing, sidewalk, seawall cap, and anchoring system. The City will also install 500 cubic yards (CY) of seawall backfill material and 325 LF of seawall including the cap, anchoring replacement, and railing. 1,300 LF of sidewalk and 9,000 square feet (SF) of sod will be restored adjacent to the seawall for stabilization. Demolition debris from the fishing pier was disposed of at Tomoka Farms Road Landfill (GPS Coordinates: 29.129392, -81.093923). The City is responsible for obtaining the permits and/or exemptions from the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and/or the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) regarding the restoration of the seawall.
<b>Project Alternatives:</b>	FEMA has considered the no-action alternative and has found that it would not be feasible as the area will remain vulnerable to flood risk, including property damage and hazards to human life and safety. The no-action alternative would potentially have adverse social, economic, and public safety impacts to the community. Alternate locations were not considered for the seawall as it is functionally dependent upon its location within the floodplain. Alternate locations for the fishing pier were not considered because there is already another fishing pier at the park for guests to use, which facilitates open space recreation.
<b>Comments:</b>	This will serve as the final public notice regarding the above-described action funded by the FEMA PA program.
